An important message from our Attendance Officer, Mrs J Evans

I have been the Attendance Officer at Rhosnesni High School for a number of years. As a parent myself, I recognise the importance of children attending school regularly in order to support their academic achievement. Every day I am a visible presence at the school gate and I am readily available if parents/carers wish to contact the school regarding attendance issues or concerns.

We politely request that if your child is unable to attend school the following process is followed:

Absences should be reported by 9.05am, either by:

1. Email - attendance@rhosnesni-high.wrexham.sch.uk
2. Telephone - 01978 340947
3. Free text – 07786 200444. Either text directly to report an absence or reply to an absence text message. Either way, the text is free to send.

In accordance with our Attendance Policy, please note that holidays taken in term time are NOT an entitlement, but are approved at the school's discretion. Holidays will NOT be authorised in any circumstances for pupils in Year 9, 10 and 11. For pupils in Years 7-8 they will only be authorised in extreme and extenuating circumstances.

To encourage and support students, parents and carers, Rhosnesni High School also provides a rewards incentive for high attendance. There are monthly awards for 100% attendance, prizes this term are:

School Council

My name is Holly. I am Head Girl, Associate Student Governor and a pro-active member of our School Council. The School Council meet every Friday during registration time for approximately 20 minutes. At regular intervals we hold an extended meeting which allows students to discuss issues in greater depth.

To aid communication we have set up a School Council Group email account via Hwb. It is our intention to keep in touch on a regular basis, send out minutes and agendas ahead of meetings and to request agenda items for the next meeting.

All School Council members have been issued with School Council note books to note down concerns/matters which members in their form have raised. The notebook allows School Council reps, to record concerns and ensure issues raised are addressed and fed back.

The School Council supported the Christmas Concert event in December, serving refreshments, selling raffle tickets and collecting items to create Christmas Hampers. The School Council raised over £600. The Council decided to donate half of the money to Nightingale House and the remainder was used to sponsor Josh Haynes in Yr 11. He shaved his hair in order to raise money for Macmillan Cancer "Brave the Shave."

To celebrate St David's Day The Council supported a non uniform day on Friday 22nd February. A total of £457.00 was raised. This money will be deployed to develop the school garden as part of the Anti Bullying/Nurture projects.

The School Council has been involved in examining the current school uniform policy and making suggestions on how to improve our uniform. One suggestion has been asking parents/ carers to donate items of uniform that their child has outgrown.

Key Stage 3 School Council representatives have recently participated in a learning walk, looking at the school corridors and grounds and what we need to do to improve the environment. The key points included:

- Perspex to cover notice boards in corridors
- New flooring in the Humanities corridor
- Redevelopment of the garden area by the Hall.

“Rhosnesni READS!” is Rhosnesni’s exciting new bespoke reading initiative! Since February half term pupils are encouraged to bring to school books they have read. They engage in a brief, one to one oral ‘book check’ after which each book successfully discussed is logged and counts towards The Rhosnesni Reads Award. Ten books can be read for achievement of the Bronze Award, a further twenty-five for achievement of the Silver Award; and a further fifty books towards the Gold Award. A book list has been compiled to aid reading guidance and the focus is on ‘reading for enjoyment’. It is acknowledged that unless reading is enjoyed it is unlikely to become a recreational activity and pupils will not become ‘real’, lifelong readers. Books may be sourced from home, school library, public library - anywhere! Please support your child by talking about books and encourage reading!


Student Data
