After an extremely busy 8 weeks, the school will close on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> October at 3.00pm for the half term holiday. School will re-open on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> November. Friday 27<sup>th</sup> October will be a staff training day.

This is a great opportunity for students to work with Maths teachers on the core preparations for the GCSE examinations. Refreshments and equipment will be provided. Thank you for your ongoing support in working together with our school to achieve success for your children.


