As we rapidly approach the Christmas holiday, I would like to reflect on some of the recent successes of Team Rhosnesni.

Remarkably, we have improved school attendance by nearly 3% this term. My colleagues have worked tirelessly to challenge and support families with a history of poor attendance. Fewer children are now missing lessons, with some very pleasing results. We know that there is a significant correlation between good attendance and academic achievement. Please continue to support us as we strive for maximum progress and the best possible results.

Our Year 11 students are on course for record breaking outcomes in the summer term. Our mantra of 'no pressure, just practice' is well embedded and our senior students are embracing the challenges of GCSE preparation. Understandably, we are proud of them and optimistic about their chances. I would like to thank staff for their commitment to our young people. Many teachers are staying late or working through lunch to provide bespoke support for willing learners.

The biggest Year 7 cohort in our recent history has settled in extremely well. The children are polite, well-presented and enthusiastic. It has been wonderful to see so many students attending their local school, proudly wearing the smart blue blazer of Ysgol Rhosnesni. These young people are a credit to you, as parents, and a valuable addition to the team. Current predictions are that we are again looking at oversubscription in September 2020. This is yet another indication that the 'Rhosnesni Way' is what local parents want. We will continue to insist on the highest of standards for all students. We will continue to build a culture based on respect, honesty and success – RHS. We will continue to accept only the best for our young people.

I would like to thank the retiring Chair of Governors, Councillor Dave Hughes, and Mrs Lesley Closs, Vice-Chair, for their long and loyal service. Mr Hughes and Mrs Closs have made a significant contribution to Ysgol Rhosnesni over a number of years. We wish them the very best for the future.

Finally, we welcome our new Chair of Governors, Councillor Paul Jones, and our new Vice-Chair, Mrs Nina Porter. They are both passionate supporters of this school and have a wealth of invaluable experience. They share my ambitious vision for Rhosnesni and I am delighted to be working with them.

Team Rhosnesni's commitment to improving students' attendance remains a key priority this year. We strongly believe that by working in partnership with parents and students we can continue to raise standards of attendance and punctuality in a bid to achieve our whole school attendance target of 97%.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all parents/carers who have wholeheartedly supported our attendance initiatives and share some of the successes achieved to date:

- Overall school attendance has improved by approximately 3% since the same time last year.
- Year 7 attendance is the highest in the whole school and is above national average.
- Punctuality to school has improved significantly and recorded lates have declined by 1%. This is the result of a robust lates strategy enforced by the Pastoral Teams and supported by parents/carers.

There is still a significant amount of work to do if we are to achieve the 97% target. The rationale for this aspirational target is that regular attendance in school is a key indicator of success at GCSE. In fact, research demonstrates that just 17 days absent from school a year could lead to a drop in a GCSE grade in all subjects.

We would like to remind parents that all students should strive to achieve full attendance. Minor illness is not a valid reason not to attend school. Where possible, medical appointments should be arranged outside of school hours. For medical appointments to be authorised we require a copy of the appointment slip/letter detailing the time and date of the appointment. If this is not available a confirmation slip showing the appointment will suffice. A full day will not be authorised for a medical appointment that is in the morning, or vice versa for the afternoon, unless there is a requirement to travel.

Please note if your child misses 10 days (20 sessions) **in total** due to sickness we will request a doctor's note for every future illness stating the reason for the absence.

We politely request that if your child is unable to attend school the following process is followed:

Absences should be reported by 9.05am on the morning of each day of absence either by:

Holidays during term time are strongly discouraged and will **not** be authorised in accordance with our Attendance Policy.

A New Curriculum For Wales

A new curriculum is being developed for schools in Wales. The curriculum became available from April 2019 for feedback. A final version will be available in January 2020 and will be used throughout Wales by 2022. The new curriculum will have more emphasis on equipping our students for life. It will build their ability to learn new skills and apply their subject knowledge more positively and creatively. A new digital competence framework is now introducing digital skills across our curriculum, preparing students for the opportunities and risks that an online world presents. Meanwhile our teachers will have more freedom to teach in ways they feel will have the best outcomes for our learners.

The central focus of assessment arrangements will be to ensure students understand how they are performing and what they need to do next. There will be a renewed emphasis on assessment for learning as an essential and integral feature of learning and teaching.

The purpose of the new curriculum is to support our children to be:

- ambitious, capable learners, ready to learn throughout their lives
- enterprising, creative contributors, ready to play a full part in life and work
- ethical, informed citizens of Wales and the world
- healthy, confident individuals, ready to lead fulfilling lives as valued members of society.

It will have six 'Areas of Learning and Experience (AoLE).

- Expressive Arts.
- Health and Well-Being.
- Humanities (including RE which should remain compulsory to age 16).
- Languages, Literacy and Communication (including Welsh, which should remain compulsory to age 16, and Modern Foreign Languages).
- Mathematics and Numeracy.
- Science and Technology.

It will also include three cross-curricular responsibilities: Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Competence.

Assessment is a continuous process and takes place on a daily basis in schools. Progression reference points help learners, teachers, parents and carers to understand if appropriate progress is being made and therefore, 'Key Stages' will be replaced. 'Progression Steps' will set out expectations for our students in each area of their learning relating broadly to ages 5, 8, 11, 14 and 16.

Progress Reviews: A Guide For Parents/Carers of KS3 Pupils (Years 7, 8 and 9 Pupils)

The Rhosnesni Grading System. The new curriculum for Wales is currently being developed and will be introduced in schools from 2020 with a move towards a full roll-out in 2022. At Rhosnesni High School, all students in Years 7, 8 and 9 will now be assessed using GCSE grades. This is in response to the new curriculum for Wales. Key Stages are being removed and replaced with "progression steps", which will provide reference points and a "road map" for pupils according to their individual needs. At Rhosnesni, the GCSE grading system ranges from A* for the highest achievement to G for the lowest achievement. All teachers will be awarding grades based on GCSE marking criteria.

We believe that it is very important that teachers, parents, and our students view progress as a journey which takes five years. Strong, steady progress and assessment whilst building knowledge and developing skills, is the key to GCSE success. Students are not expected to move up the scale quickly. Progress should be steady and secure over time.

What are the benefits of using GCSE grades throughout all years?

- It encourages all students to stretch themselves;
- It is easier for teachers, students and parents to monitor progress over time. As students are measured against the same criteria from Year 7 through to Year 11, we can clearly see the progress each individual is making in all subjects
- The language used to report to students and parents will be the same, making it easier for students to understand what they need to do to move on, and for parents to be involved in their child's progress.

Tracking Points. In each subject area, our students will undertake an assessment at several points throughout the year. This may be an exam style test, an assignment or an extended piece of homework. At each tracking point, teachers will choose a grade which reflects what they predict the student will achieve if they continue working at the current rate.

We have set aspirational targets using a range of data for all of our students. It needs to be stressed that these targets are aspirational and are there to motivate your child to try to do his or her best. We acknowledge that performance can vary from assessment to assessment and parents should expect some variance in achievement across subjects and throughout the year. We review these targets at the beginning of every academic year



